Concept of Gender Association

Laughter, The Best Medicine:

Contd... Development of Peoples' Skills By J.A.Jeyanathan

SACEM has already been active to some extent in the field of Skills Development. For over the past three years it has been a leader in imparting skills in the Computer field, free of charge, to Seniors, Housewives and Unemployed persons. Over 150 persons in the Community have benefitted from its programmes. This service will be intensified in the future years.

Other areas of Skills Development which will form the focus of SACEM's attention are as follows:

Developing Managerial Skills:

These skills, broadly classified as :managerial" cover a wide field from 'planning' and 'communication' to 'delegation' and 'time management'. Such skills are no longer the requirements of the entrepreneur and the business executive only, but are very much in demand in the work place and the home.

Promoting "Counselling" Skills:

The need for counselling skills is alarmingly high in a community where the pressures of modern life, breakdown in human relationships and addiction to evils like alcoholism are on the increase. SACEM pledges to work in this field as a matter of high priority.

Continuing "Existing" Skills Development Programme:

Over the years, SACEM has been engaged in specific programmes intended to develop the capabilities of certain groups. These continue to be relevant and will continue to be implemented. They are:

a) Parenting Skills:

Perhaps one of the society's oldest but it continues to be popular and appreciated.

b) Leadership Skills:

Directed at the youth in the community.

c) Financial Assistance:

Extending regular financial assistance to the Industrial Training School run by TRRO on house wiring and motor winding.

SACEM at the present moment in its history is thus committed to helping the community through the development of the members of the community. It earnestly appeals to its well wishers, supporters and friends to extend their moral and financial support in the furtherance of its objectives.
